WHEREAS: The American Labor Movement fought so workers injured on the job were provided aid; and

WHEREAS: All workers are the beneficiaries of the Labor Movement's accomplishments which includes weekends, establishment

of the 8-hour work week, the concept of extra pay for working overtime, sick leave, paid vacations, and days off on

Holidays; and

WHEREAS: The American Labor Movement is represented in southeast Georgia by the Savannah Regional Central Labor Council

AFL-CIO: and

WHEREAS: International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees Local 320, International Association of Machinists Local 23,

Brotherhood of Boilermakers Local 26, International Union of Operating Engineers Local 474, United Association of Plumbers and Pipefitters Local 188 and United Brotherhood of Carpenters Local 256 have each been in Savannah

for over 100 years; and

WHEREAS: Savannah landmarks like City Hall, Cathedral of St. John, Jepson Center, Memorial Hospital, St. Joseph's

Candler Hospitals, Railroad Roundhouse, Savannah Civic Center and Oglethorpe Mall are a few that were built by Organized Labor Building Trades Unions with US DOL registered and certified Training Programs.
