Mayor Johnson asked Acting City Manager Brown to give an update of Hurricane Elsa. There are still over 350 residents without electric power. Acting City Manager Brown introduced Police Chief Roy Minter for the PowerPoint presentation.

Following the presentation, there was a question and answer session with Chief Minter and Council. There were discussions which included, but were not limited to the following topics:

- high crime areas as it relates to high poverty areas;
- Gun Initiative Director, End Gun Violence Director as full-time staff member;
- retention, active officers versus number of positions and lost/separation of officers;
- programs to retain officers & more officers visible in neighborhoods;
- · cold case unit needs updating;
- SEDA program jobs for youth;
- probation and parole services and agency relationships (Savannah Impact program);
- PAL's program budget, staff and services;
- gang program/initiative prevention;

- ex-offenders used in community programs to end crime (Advocates of Restorative Communities in Savannah, ARCS taskforce);
- establish precincts in housing/neighborhood areas;
- partnering with local colleges, the housing authority & engaging retirees in programs;
- all community organizations & resources should be used as partners in addressing crime;
- employee survey recommended as a tool in improvement for morale (police);
- · current employees in police department have great ideas, listen to employees; and
- start enforcing the current policies on record;
