



Using the conservation contract, the City Cemeteries Division completed over 50 projects in 2018. These projects range in scope and size from simple monument resets to more complex projects such as the Way Mausoleum rehabilitation or the Laurel Grove Window restoration in which 39 windows were rehabilitated. In addition, we used the annual contractor, Landmark Preservation, LLC, to assist with repairs to the numerous historic structures that were damaged during Hurricane Matthew. These hurricane projects were completed in early 2018. The Greenscapes Division also uses this contract for maintenance work on the historic statues throughout the parks and squares.

The first picture is a before and after of a stone that was damaged during Hurricane Matthew. The second pair of photos is the before and after photos of the Way mausoleum in Laurel Grove North Cemetery.

In 2019, Landmark Preservation will continue its repairs to the second floor porch of the Bonaventure Administration building. Over the course of the last

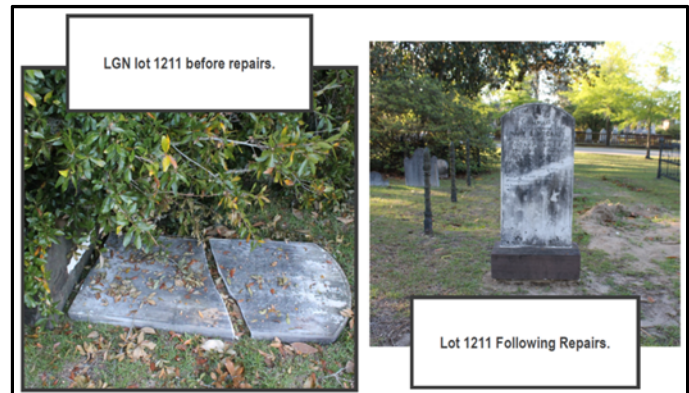

100 years, the building settled over 3 inches, causing rain to collect on the porch and leak into the first floor office. This is an extensive project as it involves the removal and replacement of a concrete slab, the addition of masonry piers to support to the building, and the reinforcement of the existing wood framing. Following the porch project, Landmark will conduct work on another mausoleum in Laurel Grove North Cemetery or begin the restoration of numerous box tombs throughout Laurel Grove North and South Cemeteries.
