To work collaboratively with local elected governmental entities in the planning and provision of athletic and recreational programs, services and facilities to meet the needs of the citizens.

Savannah/Chatham County Board of Education

What does the data show?

- Sports activities promote healthy lifestyles and safe environments for stronger neighborhoods and more wholesome communities
- Organized youth sports instill confidence in young athletes to be part of a team and to make new friends in a safe environment
- Young people who participate in athletics study more, get better grades, think more about their future, aspire to attend college, and have lower suspension and expulsion rates.

2018 Program: City of Savannah - Parks & Recreation Department

- Boys and girls teams
- 6 to 17 years of age
- 90 teams & 90 coaches
- 555 youth participants
- City game gymnasiums: Windsor Forest Regional Center, John Delaware Regional Center, Eastside Regional Center (at Shuman Elementary School) and the Tompkins Regional Center.
- Practice gymnasiums: W.W. Law Regional Center and the Grant Center.
- Practices: limited to 2 per week in December and ended once games began in January.
- 2018 basketball season total cost: \$42,000. This includes the cost of site supervisors, officials, scorekeepers, clock operators and police security.

2018 Program: Chatham County Government

- Boys basketball teams
- 5 to 14 years of age
- 24 teams & 50 volunteer coaches
- 240 youth participants
- Gymnasiums (games and practices): Armstrong State University Arena, West Broad YMCA, the Hellenic Center, and Kingdom Life Church Gymnasium.
- 2018 youth basketball program estimated cost: \$28,000. This includes the cost of gym rentals, officials, clock operator and equipment.

2018 Program: Savannah/Chatham County Public School System

- Middle and high school basketball teams for boys and girls
- 11 to 18 years of age
- Gym availability impacted by Georgia High School Association athletic program
- COS able to:
 - Host games at Johnson High School, DeRenne Middle School and Myers Middle School;
 - Host tournaments on one weekend in March at Beach and Jenkins high schools, Oglethorpe Charter School, and Woodville/Tompkins; and
 - Hold practices at Oglethorpe Charter School, Woodville/Tompkins, Myers Middle, DeRenne Middle and Haven Elementary in December.

2019 COS Winter Expansion Goal :

• 906 youth participants (20% increase in youth served)

• Equates to an additional: **111** youth, **18** teams, **18** coaches, **88** games,

5 practice gyms and **4** practice/game gyms
