# ISSUE:

The Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent-Ardmore Neighborhood Association has filed a petition to designate the area from Victory Drive to 55<sup>th</sup> Lane and Bull Street to Waters Avenue as a Conservation District.


# **BACKGROUND**

The Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent-Ardmore neighborhood is an established, historic neighborhood with distinctive architecture and landscape design. The neighborhood association is seeking to have some protection from unnecessary demolitions of historic buildings by establishing the Conservation District. This would require that all demolitions of historic buildings are reviewed by the Planning Commission at a public hearing and public notice would be provided.

Ardsley Park and Chatham Crescent were developed at approximately the same time (1910-1930) by two different developers. Ardmore was developed a little later (late 1920s to 1940s). Because of the difference in the development timeframe, which resulted in subtle differences in architectural styles and building sizes, staff is recommending the creation of two Conservation Districts- one for Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent and a separate district for Ardmore. No change in the overall boundaries of is proposed. The two Conservation Districts follow the boundaries of the neighborhood association as outlined in the neighborhood's bylaws.

# **FINDINGS**:

- 1. **Public Notice:** A courtesy notification was mailed to property owners within the boundaries of the proposed overlays.
- 2. **Existing Development Pattern:** Neighborhoods within the Conservation Overlay Districts are generally characterized as predominantly single family with some multifamily residential uses interspersed with neighborhood scale retail. Civic uses including schools and churches are also located within the districts.
- 3. Overlay Boundaries: The overlay applies to a defined geographic area delineated in the associated maps (maps 1 and 2). The Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent Overlay District (CD-1) boundaries are Victory Drive to the north, 55<sup>th</sup> Lane and 51<sup>st</sup> Street to the south, Bull Street to the west, and Habersham and Waters to the east.



Map 1: Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent Conservation District (CD-1)

The Ardmore Overlay District (CD-2) extends from 51<sup>st</sup> Street to the north to 55<sup>th</sup> Lane to the south, Habersham Street to the west and Waters Avenue to the east. Any demolition of a contributing building within the boundaries would be subject to the restrictions outlined in the associated text amendment (file no. 17-007079-ZA).

- 4. **Transportation Network:** Victory Drive, Bull Street, Abercorn Street, Waters Avenue, and 52<sup>nd</sup> Street are the primary vehicular travel ways in the area.
- 5. **Public Services and Facilities:** The properties identified on the corresponding map are served by Metropolitan Police Department, City fire protection and by City water and sewer.
- 6. **Land Use Element:** The adopted <u>Tri-Centennial Comprehensive Plan</u> Future Land Use Map will not be amended as a result of the proposed overlay. Both the base zoning districts and existing land use categories will remain unchanged for properties within the overlay.
- 7. **Zoning:** Although the base zoning district will not be changed for any property in the overlay, the corresponding text amendment, which establishes the overlay, states that in the event of any conflict between the base district and the overlay the more restrictive standards shall apply.

Hello my name is Michael Johnson. I am a Resident of Ardsley Park for over 10 years. I am also a Registered Architect with a practice here in town.

I would like to commend the effort to establish this conservation district for Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent – Ardmore Neighborhood. I would like to state my full support for this approval.

I believe this is an excellent first step to insure the ongoing development pressure I have seen over the last few years does not negatively impact the character of this great Savannah Neighborhood. As an architect I can assure you that thoughtful planning measures like this one are often the greatest tool to encourage thoughtful and sustained development.

I also feel this Amendment is appropriately restrained. It does not impose any overdue burden on property owners seeking to improve home value or accommodate life changes.

Ardsley Park, like other neighborhoods developed in the teens and twenties, has a unique place in our Architectural History and today. This period, impacted by the first waves of internationalism, offered new options to Architects, Builders and Homeowners. It represented a American period of individuality where people felt free to construct a Georgian home next door to an English Tudor, then onward to an Arts and Crafts style. Few periods represent developments with these types of varied and eclectic styles in all mixed together to form a neighborhood community.

For this reason, it is important that planning regulations be light-handed, as this one is. We must continue to allow a this rich mix of development without risking the total loss of the structures contributing to this fabric.

That being said, I do believe further steps in the future should be considered. I would support this board and MPC Staff, along with the Neighborhood Community Association in further defining the evolving list of which structures should be considered contributing. This information is critical to any sustained developing community. Landowners, Prospective Buyers, and Investors must be given as high a degree of uncertainty as possible if we expect to see continued investment and thoughtful long-term development within our community moving forward.

I'm writing in enthusiastic support of the petition by the Ardsley Park-Chatham Crescent Neighborhood Association to create a conservation district in their neighborhood. Although the area is one of several National Register Historic Districts in Savannah, this area lacks any protection against indiscriminant demolitions. Being a National Register Historic District is purely honorific and is powerless to stop any demolition requests.

Ardsley Park and Chatham Crescent, separate early automobile suburbs both established in 1910 by rival developers, retain a remarkable degree of architectural integrity and harmony, despite the diversity of housing styles, materials and sizes. This is mainly due to the relatively compact pre-World War II time period in which most of the houses were developed. The housing stock of these two now-combined neighborhoods possesses a high quality of materials and craftsmanship that is difficult to replicate today. Many of the finest early 20<sup>th</sup>-century houses in Savannah can be found in this area and some that are unique in the city.

Having a conservation district designation would provide a much-needed level of oversight to ensure that architecturally and/or historically significant buildings are not torn down without strong justification. This designation would not prevent new development from occurring on vacant lots, nor would it prevent owners from modifying their houses, such as erecting an addition.
