
Nancy Hull Nichols Calhoun

Nancy Hull Nichols Calhoun, 75, died Monday, December 29, 2003 at Azalealand Nursing Home. A native of Savannah, and the daughter of the late Edgar Henry Nichols and Nannie Hull Nichols, she was a graduate of Pape School and attended Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg, VA. She was a member of the Junior League of Savannah over fifty years holding several official Board positions. She was a former member of the Married Women's Card Club and a member of the Board of the Savannah Home for Girls, later known as the Parent and Child Development Service, and also served on the Speech and Hearing Board. She was an active Ardsley Park neighborhood volunteer in numerous fund drives, a Charles Ellis School PTA member for ten years and had a career in real estate sales for a number of years. She was a sixth generation lifelong member of the Independent Presbyterian Church. Her grandfather, Robert M. Hull, was Mayor of Savannah from 1925-1927 and Hull Park is named in his honor. She was a descendant of the Honorable Francis Harris who came to the Georgia Colony from England around 1740. Harris was elected Speaker of the First Georgia Assembly in 1751 and received one of the first Land Grants in the Colony issued by King George II of England in 1756. She is survived by husband of 54 years, Andrew P. Calhoun, Savannah; sons and daughter-in-law, Andrew P. Calhoun, Jr. and Milree M. Calhoun, Savannah and Henry M.
