# Berkshire Study Recommendations

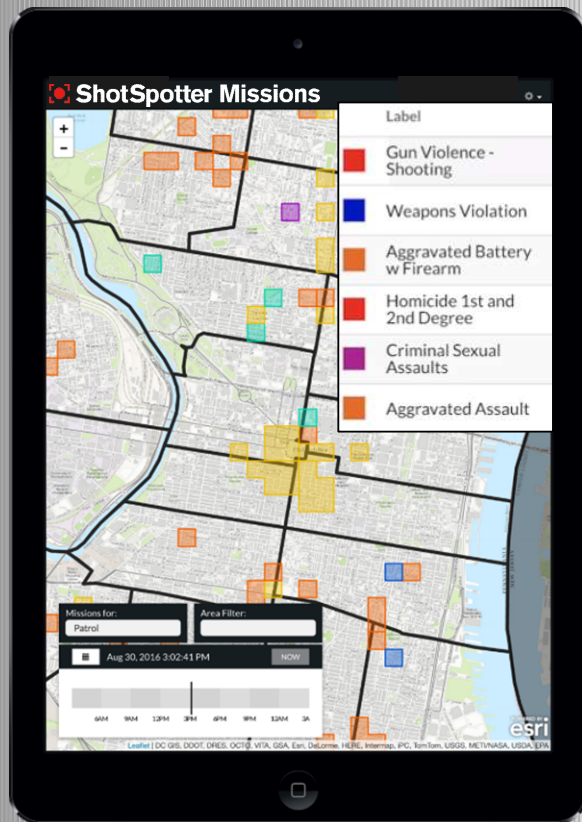
(In Progress)

- Steps to reduce salary compression (Awaiting Pay and Comp)\* Upon Council approval , Pay and Comp will complete this task
- Assess the need to provide incentives for officers to accept centralized investigative assignments (Review after pay and comp)
- Electronic time tracking (2019-20) In the funding request from OMB Pending Council Approval (pilot will start with the Police Department)
- Develop case file management alternatives (Currently meeting with IT and vendors to identify solution) Still in
