A champagne bar generally attracts an older crowd who's main purpose is to sip and enjoy champagne. Getting drunk or acting disorderly is not the goal. The admitted crowd will be kept to less that legally allowed especially with the Covid virus.

There are 8 security cameras throughout the space monitoring the coming and going of patrons. The space is wide open without visual restriction to keep an eye on the customers.

3....Parking.

Parking at this location is either on street or in the Whitaker Parking garage one block away therefore no parking controls are necessary. Whitaker St does not allow any stopping or double parking because of its size.

4...Security

Signs will be posted and plainly visible indicating no persons under 21 admitted. There will also be a sign saying firearms are not allowed on premises. This is not a traditional night club and there is no dancing on premises. It's is a low key lounge vibe and at this location if it's necessary to have a door person then one will be employed to control who comes into the bar.

5 ...Underage.

Every patron will be carded. There is a DIGITAL CLOCK posted right by the cash register that shows the day, date and year of legal drinking age. It is in the line of sight so there is no confusion on the cutoff date for serving. There is also a ID card scanner by the register to be sure IDs are valid and legal.

(See photo). ALL EMPLOYEES AND OWNER/MANAGER will complete an alcohol serving training course and completion certificates are kept in a binder in premises.

6....Fire

This particular space has a central sprinkler systems along with the required inspected fire extinguishers. There is no open flame cooking facilities on location. There are three clearly marked exit doors in the space. The front entry and exit glass door. A back door leading to a central hallway and to an exterior door on the north end of the building. The third back door exits from the kitchen are directly to the lane on the south side of the building. There is also a fire detector as part of the monitored alarm system. Fire extinguisher will be clearly marked.

7... Emergencies

The staff is all well versed on immediately guiding patrons to exits. In the case of an unruly patron there is a monitored panic button part of the overall alarm system. A manager is always on premises while the bar is open.
