Hours of Operation

Folklore Restaurant will be open seven days a week with a morning brunch service from 8am to 12:30pm, close from 12:30pm to 6pm, and then reopen for dinner service from 6pm to 10pm.

Crowd Management

As a higher-end restaurant, we will only allow staff and seated guests in the restaurant. We will have a Host, three Servers, one Service Captain and one Manager to handle guests. We have cameras on the dining room, kitchen, and exteriors of the building to observe guest behavior in and around our building.

Parking

There are several parking garages within walking distance of the restaurant as well as ample street parking on the adjacent streets. We will also employ a valet service to park guest vehicles per guest request.

Premises Access

The building has three locking doors as well as a padlocked basement as well as security cameras on all sides of the building. Guests of the establishment will be greeted by a host and either directed to a seat or referred to Franklin Square or other areas to wait for a table to become available.

Underage Guests

All guests will be required to show ID before being served alcohol by the establishment. Hosts will query the guest upon arrival and Servers will confirm by physically checking the ID. Servers will be required to do the math for any guest born after the year 2000. Servers waiting on underage guests will be required to check in more frequently to confirm the underage guest is not drinking alcoholic beverages served to guests of drinking age.

Fires

Fires are always a risk in restaurants; the establishment is outfitted with an ANSUL system to combat fires in the kitchen, fire extinguishers placed around the kitchen and dining room, and an expansive sprinkler system in the dining room. Kitchen staff will be trained on the care required using natural gas appliances as well as techniques to avoid uncontrolled fires. All employees will be trained for emergency

preparedness. In the event of a fire, the Manager, Chef or Service Captain will direct all guests to exit the building in an orderly fashion through both doors; the Host will call 911 and servers will assist in escorting guests to safety. The kitchen staff will exit through the kitchen door.

Other Emergencies

Other emergencies can happen any time; we choose to follow the motto of the Boy Scouts of America: Be Prepared. We plan on meeting with a representative from the police department before opening to discuss situations they frequently encounter in the entertainment district and start with a healthy and communicative relationship with the Savannah PD.

In the event of a guest injury, the manager will assess the situation and determine whether the injury is superficial and can be treated with simple first aid or whether the guest needs to seek professional medical attention and call the appropriate entity to address the injury.

In the event of a shooting in the area, the doors will be locked by the staff and the authorities called by the host. Guests will be escorted to the rear of the dining room until Savannah PD clears the area.

The establishment will not be open during extreme weather events like hurricanes, severe storms, tornados, or hauntings.

In the event that the Tybee Island nuclear warhead detonates, guests will be instructed to duck under their tables and cover their heads with their hands. Maybe say some nice last words.
