Fontaine's Public Safety Plan

Fontaine's will be open from Monday thru Saturday from 6pm-11pm. Closed Sunday.

We are not open to the general public. We are a bar to be used exclusively by tour groups. As a result we will have a schedule of the different tour groups coming inside, so the crowds never become excessive.

We do not have any no loitering signs outside. We will have two cameras installed inside, and 1 outside.

All parking in the area is public, and is under the control of the city.

We will have security on busy nights such as weekends, and they will be trained in house. By not allowing the general public, and partnering exclusively with the tour companies, we will know the exact number of people in each group so excessive crowds won't become an issue due to our ability to make a schedule.

Our customers can't join the tour groups unless they are 21 years of age. We will require a photo ID to be presented for every single drink served. The servers will enforce the required birth date, by knowing the date and year required for sale. We will have 2 different layers of enforcement, both the customer having to purchase a tour ticket for a 21 and above tour, and requiring a non-expired state identification for every drink sold.

No person under the age of 21 is permitted at anytime. As a tour owner myself I know it is very rare for a young person under 21 to attempt to spend anywhere from \$30-\$100 to go on a pub tour. Every customer will be required by the Tour companies to be 21+ years of age and Fontaine's will require an ID for every drink sold.

We do not have a kitchen, so there are no open flames anywhere on the premises. We will have updated certified fire extinguishers located both behind the bar, and in the storage unit behind the bathrooms if a fire were to break out.

When a fire alarm sounds, or another emergency ensues the manager that night will act immediately to ensure patrons safety. Everyone will be directed to evacuate the building by way of the closest exit. Once outside the building, the manager will move everyone away from the building, by assembling them along the sidewalk. At the point where everyone is outside/safe the manger will call 911 to report the emergency to emergency response. And wait for clearance from either the police or the fire department to reenter.
