

YARD WASTE MANAGEMENT EVENT NO. 8059

SECTION II SCOPE OF WORK

2.0 Broad Description of Project: The City of Savannah is requesting proposals from qualified vendors to process yard trimmings collected or generated by City operations including residential yard waste and urban forestry debris. Further management of the residuals from these processing operations may also be considered as an option. All yard waste processing operations and residuals management shall be conducted in accordance with all applicable state and local regulations. This request for proposals anticipates processing and residuals management activities which will not take place at the City of Savannah's facility. This request for proposals (RFP) also includes the potential disposal of processed vegetative debris as the result of a natural disaster. All disposed products, including processed material, are owned by the processing contractor. Disposal will be Monday through Saturday 7:00 am - 5:00 pm (EST).

A pre-bid conference has been scheduled to be conducted as a telephone conference meeting. Please use the call-in number, 312-626-6799, meeting ID 649-261-0186, if you would like to attend this meeting. This meeting will allow contractors to discuss the specifications and address any issues that may have arisen with City staff. You are invited to attend.

2.1 Terms

This is an annual contract and prices are to be held firm. The first term shall begin on the date of award and end one year after. This agreement may be renewed for up to four (4) additional 12-month periods, if all contracting parties so agree and services provided by the vendor have been satisfactory. In the event this contract is not renewed prior to the expiration of any term, this contract shall continue to be honored on a month-to-month basis until this contract has been renewed.

2.2 Definitions:

For the purposes of this RFP, yard trimmings shall mean:

- tree stumps
- tree trunks
- leaves
- brush
- grass
- clippings
- shrub and tree pruning

- discarded Christmas trees
- nursery and greenhouse vegetative residuals
- vegetative matter resulting from urban forestry activities,
- as well as landscaping development and maintenance other than mining, agricultural, and silviculture operations.

2.3 Quantities:

The estimated quantity of material to be handled is approximately 15,000 - 18,000 tons annually. Quantities are estimates only; may vary.

2.4 Qualifications:

The proposer shall submit a summary of its qualifications and experience. This summary should include, at a minimum, a list and brief description of relevant, on-going projects of similar nature, a list and brief description of relevant previous projects, a list of operative equipment currently owned or leased by the proposer, and the number of permanent employees on the proposer's payroll. Strong preference will be given to proposers with successful experience in municipal yard waste management programs or similar large scale processing operations. Additional information such as agency brochures, resumes, etc. may be submitted as appropriate. This should be submitted through the City of Savannah Supplier Portal by attaching it to this event with your response.

2.5 Methodology:

The proposer shall submit the proposed methodology and process outline for yard trimmings processing operations including personnel and equipment resources to be used, proposed processing service interval, and residuals management plan, if any. To be considered, this must be submitted with the proposal.

2.6 Fees:

The proposer shall provide a unit cost, priced per ton, for yard trimmings processing and residuals management.

2.7 References:

The proposer shall furnish at least four (4) references from accounts worked with of similar size and magnitude for the same type of services proposed. References shall include a contact person and phone number. Failure to provide suitable references shall be cause for rejection of the proposal (See Attachment 1).

2.8 Insurance Requirements

2.8.1 Commercial General Liability

Contractor shall carry commercial general liability on an occurrence form with no "x, c or u" exclusions with the following minimum limits:

Contractor shall provide Certificate of Insurance reflecting the required coverage.

This policy provides a Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah its agents, and / or employees, and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

No exclusions on Products Completed / Operations for either ongoing and / or completed projects / operations.

This policy provides a thirty (30) day cancellation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah, its agents, and / or employees and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

2.8.2 Commercial Auto:

The automobile policy must include coverage for owned, non-owned, and hire automobiles.

• Minimum limits are \$1,000,000 Per Occurrence & Aggregate

Contractor shall provide a Certificate of Insurance reflecting required coverage.

This policy provides a Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah, its agents and / or employees, and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

This policy provides a thirty (30) day cancellation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah, its agents and / or employees, and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

2.8.3 Workers Compensation & Employers Liability

Contractor shall carry a worker's compensation policy including coverage of all employees, volunteers and others under your direction and supervision.

Minimum employer's liability limits:

- Part A: Workers Compensation: Statutory
- Part B: Bodily Injury By Accident: \$500,000 Each Accident Bodily Injury By Disease: \$500,000 Policy Limit Bodily Injury By Disease: \$500,000 Each Employee

Contractor shall provide Certificate of Insurance reflecting required coverage.

This policy provides a Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah, its agents and / or employees, and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

This policy provides a thirty (30) day cancellation endorsement in favor of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Savannah, its agents and / or employees, and must be attached to the Certificate of Insurance.

2.9 Proposal Format:

Proposals shall be submitted in the following format and include the following information.

- a) Cover letter stating the intent of the Proposer for this event. Cover letter must include acknowledgement of all addenda issued for this proposal. If addenda are not acknowledged in the cover letter, proposals will not be considered further.
- b) Detailed description of methodology as requested
- c) Fee Proposals per instructions in Section III signed by responsible party
- d) Proposed Schedule of DBE Participation and Non-Discrimination Statement.

2.10 Basis of Award:

Proposals will be evaluated according to the following criteria and weight:

- a) Proposer's qualifications and experience, including support capabilities (20 points)
- b) Technical capabilities (20 points)
- c) Fees (20 points)
- d) References (10 points)
- e) SBE/DBE participation goals (10 points)
- f) Savannah First Local vendor participation (20 points total) Vendors within the city limits of Savannah and have a City of Savannah Business Tax Certificate prior to April 1, 2020 will receive a total of 20 points. Vendors outside the city limits but located within Chatham County will receive a total of 10 points.

Proposals shall be evaluated by a selection committee. The selection committee may, at its option, request any or all proposers to provide on-site demonstrations of the proposed system.

A short list may be developed, and interviews conducted with those proposers deemed to be most qualified. The City reserves the right to conduct interviews of any or all proposers at the City's discretion. The City also reserves the right to request a best and final offer (BFO) and to re-score evaluations based on the best and final offer. Proposers may be required to provide clarification of their proposal as part of the BFO response.

- **2.11 Copies:** One (1) unbound, printed and signed original and five identical, printed copies of the proposal and supporting documents must be submitted in response to the RFP. All responses must relate to the specifications as outlined.
- **2.12 Contacts:** Proposers must submit proposals in accordance with the instructions contained in this RFP. All requested information must be submitted with the proposal. Instructions for preparation and submission of proposals are contained in this package. All questions regarding this request for proposal should be submitted in writing and emailed to the person listed on the summary event page

2.13 Local Vendor Definition

A bidder or business shall be considered a local vendor if it meets all of the following requirements:

- a) The bidder or business must operate and maintain a regular place of business with a physical address within the corporate limits of the city, and
- b) The bidder or business must at the time of bid or quotation submission, have a current city business tax certificate issued by the City for at least one (1) year prior to the issuance of the requested competitive quote, bid, or proposal by the City (a post office box or temporary office shall not be considered a place of business), and
- c) The bidder or business performs quantifiable services in the ordinary course and scope of its business with the skills, qualifications, and expertise necessary to execute its contractual obligations to the City.

2.14 Satisfaction of DBE Goals; Good Faith Effort

The process by which the City determines whether an Offeror has met the City's DBE goal is set forth in the guidelines below:

- a. A bid shall be considered non-responsive unless a bidder meets either the DBE goal established for the contract or demonstrates good faith effort to meet the DBE goal.
- b. In order to meet the DBE goal of a solicitation, a bidder entity must submit the following information:
 - i. The names and addresses of each DBE that will participate in the contract;

- ii. A description of the work that each DBE will perform;
- iii. The percentage of the contract value that each DBE will receive.
- iv. Written documentation, in a form acceptable to OBO, of the bidder's commitment to use each DBE whose participation the bidder submits to meet the contract goal; and
- v. Written confirmation, in a form acceptable to OBO, from each DBE that it will participate in the contract as indicated by the bidder.
- c. The bidder should submit the above information as follows:
 - i. Under sealed bid procedures, the information should be provided with the sealed bid response; or
 - ii. Under requests for letters of interest or requests for proposals, the information should be provided with the initial letter of interest or proposal.
- d. If the information required by section (b) above is not provided in accordance with section (c) above, the information must be provided to the City of Savannah within three (3) business days after OBO notifies the bidder that it has not provided all the required information with its response. Failure to provide the City of Savannah with this information within such three (3) business days may be cause for the response to the solicitation to be deemed non-responsive.
- e. Determination of Good Faith Effort.
 - i. A bidder shall not be denied award of a contract due to failure to meet the assigned contract goal if the bidder timely (within the timeframes provided in paragraphs (c) and (d) above, as applicable) provides documentation demonstrating the bidder's good faith effort to meet the goal, as determined by the Program Coordinator. In making such determination, the Program Coordinator shall consider the quality, quantity, and extent of the various efforts that the bidder has made to meet the goal.
 - ii. The efforts that may be considered by the Program Coordinator include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Soliciting through activities such as attendance at pre-bid meetings, advertising, or written notices, the interest of certified DBEs (or DBEs eligible for certification) that have the ability and capacity to perform the contract work. The bidder must solicit this interest in a timely manner to allow the DBEs to respond to the solicitation. The bidder must take appropriate steps to follow up initial solicitations of DBEs.

- 2. Identifying the portions of the contract that could reasonably be performed by a DBE in order to increase the likelihood that the DBE goals will be achieved. This may include, where appropriate and commercially practicable, separating contract work items into segments more appropriate for participation by DBEs.
- 3. Providing each interested DBE with adequate information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract in a timely manner.
- 4. Negotiating in good faith with each interested DBE. Evidence of such negotiation includes the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of DBEs that were considered; a description of the information provided regarding the plans and specifications for the work selected for subcontracting; and explaining why an agreement could not be reached with an interested DBE to perform the work. The fact that there may be some additional costs involved in subcontracting with DBEs is not in itself sufficient reason for a bidder's failure to meet the contract DBE goal, as long as such additional costs are reasonable, as determined by the Program Coordinator in his or her sole discretion.
- iii. In determining whether a bidder has made a good faith effort, the Program Coordinator may also consider the level of participation proposed by the bidder and the level of participation proposed by other bidders. The closer the bidder's proposed participation is to the goal or to the proposed participation by other bidders, the greater the indication of good faith by the bidder.
- **Qualifications:** Each proposer shall submit a summary of their qualifications and experience. Additional information such as agency brochures, resumes, etc. may be submitted as appropriate.
- **2.16 Schedule:** Each proposer shall submit a proposed time schedule for the project.
- **2.17** Fees: Proposer shall submit fees based on the detailed listing in Section 3 of the RFP.
- **2.18 Acknowledgement of Addenda:** Vendor is responsible for determining and acknowledging any addenda issued in connection with this RFP. Addenda must be acknowledged in order for proposals to be considered.

Fee proposals will only be opened if after the initial evaluation, proposer is deemed to be qualified. Fee proposals will then be considered in relation to the qualification points awarded to determine the overall best proposal in terms of fees and qualifications.

All addenda must be acknowledged in the cover letter according to the terms set forth in Section 2.9 of this RFP.

SECTION 01310 LOCAL DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS EMPLOYMENT PROVISIONS

The City of Savannah actively encourages employment and participation of small and local disadvantaged businesses in all City contracts. Attention of the bidders is called to contract conditions contained herein pertaining to non-discrimination, equal employment opportunity, subcontracts, and opportunities for project area residents.

It is the policy of the City of Savannah that local disadvantaged business enterprises (LDBEs) be given fair opportunity to participate in the performance of services for the City, and that prime contractors utilize LDBE subcontractors and suppliers to the fullest extent possible consistent with the efficient performance of the contract. The City of Savannah has established an 20% DBE goal for this project of which at least 10% must be met by a Local DBE.

In order to determine compliance, bidders shall **submit the following completed documents in a separate sealed envelope** clearly marked with the bid number, project name and number and **marked (Section 1310 Local Disadvantaged Business Employment Provisions)** with their bid:

- 1. Non-discrimination statement (Sec. 01310-3) and;
- Proposed schedule of local disadvantaged business enterprise participation (Sec. 01310and;
- 3. Documentation of Good Faith Efforts [Submit only if the goals are not met.] Failure to submit the required documents shall result in the bid not being read or considered.

Suggestions to help meet the goal:

- ✓ Dividing total requirements, when economically feasible, into smaller tasks or quantities to permit maximum participation of LDBEs.
- ✓ Advertising in general circulation media, trade association publications, or disadvantaged business enterprise media to solicit bids from LDBE subcontractors or suppliers. [Advertisement should appear at least 10 days prior to bid due date, unless the City's solicitation period is shortened.]
- ✓ Designating portions of the work for LDBE subcontracting in trades with established availability of LDBE subcontractors.
- ✓ Providing a minimum of 10 days notice prior to the Bid due date to LDBEs when requesting bids or proposals for furnishing material or services as a subcontractor or supplier.

Any attempt to submit false information, will result in a recommendation that the bidder be debarred from participating in future City contracts.

The contractor is required to fulfill any LDBE utilization commitments made unless good cause is demonstrated for any failure to fulfill such commitment. **Written approval is required prior to any substitution**.

The contractor will maintain records and information necessary to document compliance with Good Faith Effort requirements, and the City shall have the right to inspect such records.

Any LDBE listed in the completed form entitled "Proposed Schedule of LDBE Participation" (Section 01310-4) must be certified by an approved agency such as USDOT, GDOT, or SBA 8(a) prior to the due date of this bid. Proof of LDBE certification such as a certificate or letter from the certifying agency is required to accompany the bid. A firm that has submitted an application for certification or an application for certification under review but has not been certified is not qualified as a certified LDBE and will not be recognized as such during the City's evaluation process.

No bidder shall enter into an agreement with any LDBE that would in any way limit the LDBE's opportunities to sell to, or act as subcontractor for, any other party. Violation of this requirement would be grounds to deem the bidder non-responsive to this bid solicitation.

6. Final Project Report Place an "X" or checkmark in this box when the project has been completed and the report submitted is the final payment report. Enter the date of project
