A: Project Description

The Georgia Historical Society (GHS) in partnership with the Waters Foundation and Hunter Maclean will erect a new historical marker on Mayor Malcolm Maclean. The historical marker text (see Supplement E) relates the history of Maclean's accomplishments as Mayor. The historical marker is to be mounted on a post and installed in Guckenheimer Park near the residence of Mayor Maclean on 45th Street.

C: Themes

The Malcolm Maclean historical marker demonstrates the themes of “Civic and Institutional,” “Social and Humanitarian,” “Industry and Commerce,” and “Military History.”

Civic and Institutional

The Malcolm Maclean historical marker demonstrates the Civic and Institutional theme through the accomplishments of Mayor Maclean. Maclean was a member of the Savannah Citizens Committee, served three years as an assistant city attorney, and in 1957 became an alderman. When Mayor Lee Mingledorff resigned, on July 29, 1960, he selected Maclean to succeed him. Maclean served until the Fall of 1966, losing a run for reelection to J. C. Lewis. Maclean supported ‘economic development and urban renewal’ and spoke of the development of an \$11.1 million plant to combat Savannah’s water pollution. Mayor Maclean was also instrumental in the establishment of Memorial Health hospital and bringing Gulfstream Aerospace to Chatham County.

Social and Humanitarian

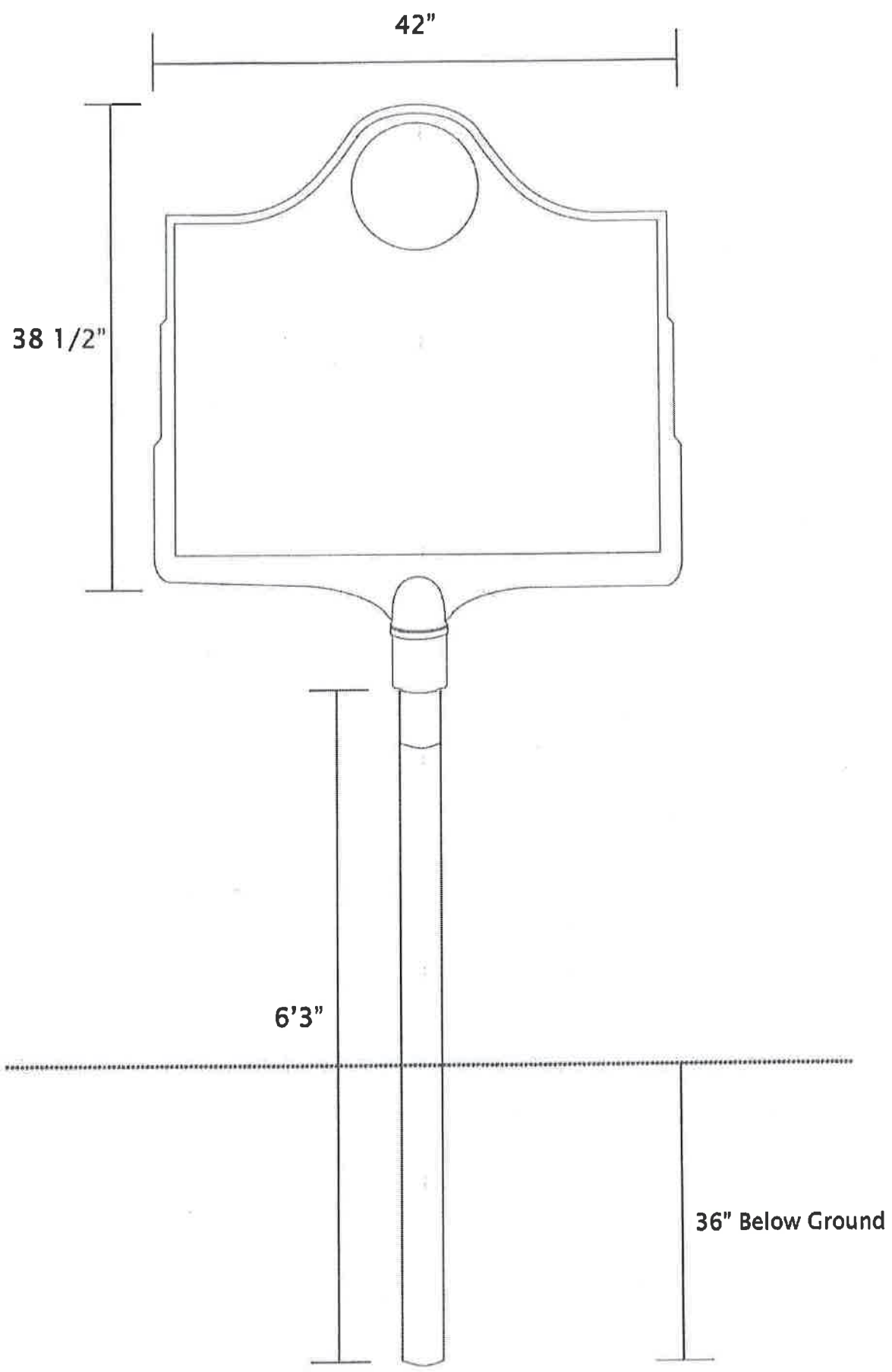
The historical marker illustrates the Social and Humanitarian theme through the discussion of Maclean’s largely non-violent desegregation and integration of Savannah during the summer of 1963. Maclean worked with members of the NAACP’s Legal Counsel, such as W. W. Law and Eugene Gadson, to implement non-violent desegregation strategies. Mayor Maclean’s tenure oversaw the desegregation of public libraries, city restrooms, and store lunch counters, as well as the removal of segregation signs.

Industry and Commerce

Maclean was a proponent of increased tourism, the building of a riverfront auditorium and a convention center complex, the expanding of library facilities, and the remodeling of police headquarters—initiatives that would eventually be implemented in Savannah after Maclean’s service as mayor. Maclean is also credited with having a role in bringing Gulfstream to Savannah and helping start Memorial Health.

Military History

Maclean served in the US Navy as commanding officer of the USS *Edsall* in World War II, and, during the latter part of the war, as commanding officer of the USS *Frankovich*. He was awarded a Bronze Star after rescuing the crew of a burning tanker during his time as commanding officer of the USS *Edsall*. Maclean also served under the rank of Commander during the Korean War for two years, marking the end of his military career.



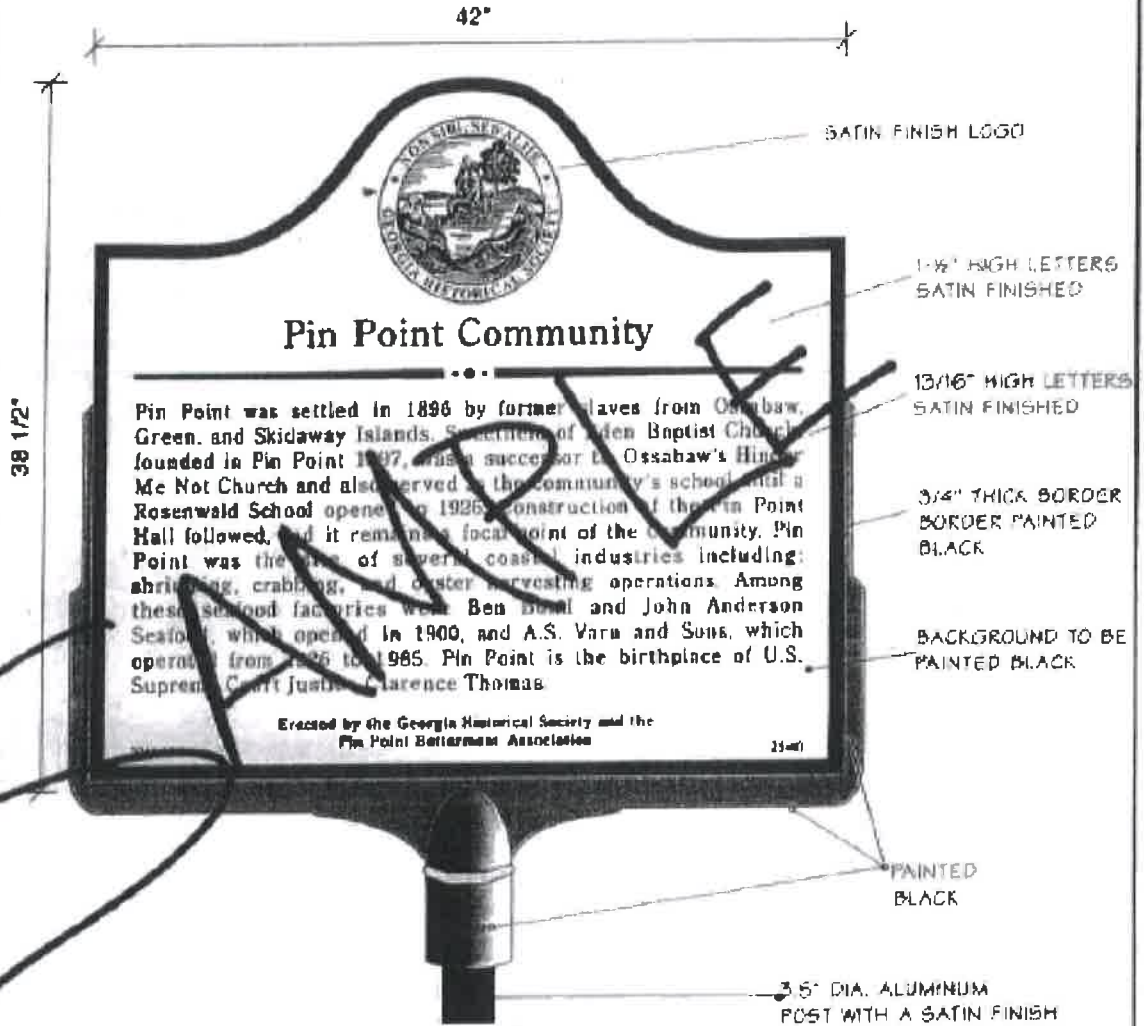
CAST ALUMINUM PLAQUE

E. Historical Marker Text

Malcolm R. Maclean (1919-2001)

Malcolm R. Maclean served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and the Korean War, rising to the rank of commander. After Harvard Law, Maclean entered Savannah politics. His fellow aldermen selected Maclean as mayor in 1960 to fill an unexpired term. Elected with bi-racial support in 1962, Maclean sought to avoid the violence surrounding the Civil Rights movement that occurred elsewhere and responded with moderation to protests and a boycott of segregated businesses. Maclean negotiated with business and civil rights leaders, including W. W. Law and Eugene Gadsden, to accomplish the largely peaceful desegregation of Savannah before the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Voters rejected Maclean's reelection bid in 1966. Maclean also helped establish Memorial Health hospital and recruit Gulfstream Aerospace. Maclean lived nearby on E. 45th Street and is buried in Bonaventure Cemetery.
