# **Broughton Street Streetscape Improvement Project Kiosks Plan**

On June 1, 2017, the City of Savannah presented information on the Broughton Street Streetscape Improvement Project to the Historic Sites and Monument Commission. Last year, the City commenced construction of the project with Phase I including both the north and south sides of the corridor from Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard to Drayton Street.

The project will transform the look of Broughton Street.
Highlights include new brick paver sidewalks, parking and crosswalks, lighting, landscaping, hardscapes, bike racks, benches and Americans with Disability Act (ADA) accessible sidewalk ramps. It will also have a festival zone which will extend along Broughton Street from Whitaker Street to Drayton



Street. The entire corridor will be repaved at the end of the project.

A key aspect of the project will include the installation of kiosks on both the north and south side of each of the six blocks which will hold electrical equipment needed to support other amenities along the street. The Historic District Board of Review reviewed the kiosks under 18-001061-COA and provided in Attachment A. The kiosk locations are included in Attachment B and summarized below. Photos of the locations are provided in Attachment C.

Each kiosk will have a display area of 18" by 42.5". Refer to Attachment D for the kiosk design.

The content for the first two kiosks—located on the 400 block of West Broughton—will focus on the Commercial and Local History along Broughton Street. The display area will include images as well as captions highlighting the evolution and revitalization of the corridor as well as local history like sit-ins and segregation. The content will not tell the full history of Broughton Street, rather it will tie back to the block where the kiosk will be located.

Attachment E provides the imagery and text for the kiosks and a summary is provided below.

#### Northern Kiosk:

The kiosk on the north side will focus on the transition of Broughton Street from a residential area to a more commercial area in the late 1800s. Sanborn Fire Insurance Map from Savannah, Chatham County indicate the location of the residential dwellings and commercial establishments which is complemented with an image looking west on Broughton Street highlighting the diversity of businesses in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.


#### South Content:

The kiosk on the south side will focus on Savannah's two primary commercial corridors—Broughton Street and Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard (formerly West Broad Street). The copy discusses the contrast between the two corridors due to segregation.

Future content for the remaining 10 kiosks will be developed by the City and submitted to the HSMC staff for consideration.

Phase I of the Broughton Street Streetscape Improvement Project has been funded by the City in the amount of \$11.2 million. The City will be maintaining the project as part of operations of various departments.

The kiosks are currently being fabricated as indicated in Attachment F. The font size and style will be submitted to the fabricator once approved for incorporation into the kiosks.



# Attachment F: Location of Kiosks along the 400 block of West Broughton





#### MID-BLOCK NORTH SIDE

#### **400 Block North Text:**

The west end of Broughton Street started to transition from residential dwellings to businesses in the late 1800s, and by the early 20<sup>th</sup> century this block was entirely commercial. At one time, the whole block was populated by Jewish merchants and businesses, like Cohen & Sons and Meinhard & Bros. (clothing stores), Wolf's Pawn Shop, Hirsch's Delicatessen, and Blumenthal's Five and Dime, among many others. The south side of the block was demolished to accommodate the Chatham County Courthouse complex parking facility.





## MID-BLOCK SOUTH SIDE

#### **400 Block South Text:**

Just west is the intersection of Broughton Street and Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard (formerly West Broad Street), historically two of Savannah's busiest commercial corridors. While Broughton Street emerged as the primary main street for white businesses, racial segregation fostered the development of the West Broad Street corridor as Savannah's African American business core. Prior to desegregation in the 1960s, along with the replacement of Union Station with the Interstate 16 flyover and various Urban Renewal efforts, the West Broad Street corridor was bustling with black-owned theaters, doctors' offices, banks, and an assortment of other businesses, along with a concentrated Jewish presence at the northern end.
