Applications that do not provide documentation or required materials will be noted as incomplete and may result in delays in the Commission or Staff's review of the application and/or denial of the request. Revisions made to the applications after the submittal deadline

and prior to the Commission hearing may be continued to the following month's hearing. The Commission reserves the right to require additional information if it believes that the submission of such information is necessary to understand the nature of the intended activity.

Annie Bell Graham – Tremont Park Matriarch March 6, 1925 – August 27, 2023

In early 1941, Ms. Annie Bell Graham and her husband, Mr. Elliott Graham, settled in Tremont Park. She was the mother of twelve biological children and served as the legal guardian for approximately sixteen additional children.

Mrs. Graham was among the first African American property owners in the Tremont Park Community. Her three-bedroom home soon expanded to five bedrooms to accommodate the growing family.

Mrs. Graham served as the "Mother of the Church" of Tremont Park Missionary Baptist Church, located in Tremont Park, for nearly sixty years.

Mrs. Graham was a dedicated community organizer who hosted numerous fundraisers in her home during the early seventies to purchase land for the first Tremont Park Community Center. The center, built and governed by Tremont Park residents, greatly benefited from her efforts. She played a vital role in assisting other community leaders in securing a newly built community center through the City of Savannah. Whenever she couldn't attend a meeting or event, she ensured her voice was heard by sending a family representative. Mrs. Graham consistently contributed to the center by cooking hams, potato salad, and her award-winning sweet potato pies for community Thanksgiving dinners and Christmas parties. She remained actively involved in community events well into her nineties.

Mrs. Annie Bell Graham embodied the spirit of a Southeastern Pioneer Woman, showcasing remarkable resilience and resourcefulness. She provided food and clothing to numerous children in Tremont Park. Families would come to her home for a hot meal and often leave with a bag of food to take home. Those who knew her as "Grandma" understood she always had something to offer, whether it was food, clothing, or a monetary gift.

Mrs. Graham provided childcare in her home for both her family and the community, continuing this care well into her nineties. She often said, "Bring the children to me, (Nigh) and you go on to work." She never charged for her childcare services and refused any money offered to her. Her home was always open to anyone in need of a place to stay. Over 500 people stayed at her home, whether for an overnight stay or for several months. With over 130 grandchildren, the number of people she sheltered could have easily been in the thousands, making her a foster grandmother to many.

Mrs. Annie Bell Graham's legacy endures through the countless lives she touched. She is a true legend and will forever be known as the "Matriarch of Tremont Park."



Requirements for Honorary Street Naming Designations. (Sec. 4-1104)

Purpose

 Honorary street name designations are intended to recognize individuals who have made significant contributions to the City. The designation will be a temporary assignment of the honorarium and shall not interfere with the official name of the street.

Restrictions

- Roadways under the control of the Federal Highway Administration, Georgia Department of Transportation or Chatham County are not subject to honorary naming.
 - Honorary designations shall be limited to one approved designation per City Council member per calendar year.
- Individual family tributes, commercially concerned and corporate-related recognitions shall not be eligible for honorary designation.

Requirements

- The proposed namesake made a sustained contribution over an appreciable time period, exerted efforts of benefit or significance to local, state or national affairs and/or demonstrated leadership in governmental, cultural or historical affairs, humanitarian efforts, or community development;
- The proposed namesake made contributions that beneficially changed the nature and characteristics of the community;
- The proposed namesake resided in the City for at least 5 years.
- A statement of reasons supporting the honorary naming request, including a discussion of the historical significance, contributions, heroic service or personal sacrifice by the honoree to the City, state or nation;
- Identification of the particular section or block of an existing City street for which the honorary designation is sought.
 - A supporting petition signed by not less than 51 percent of all property owners abutting the subject right-of-way
- An endorsement by the current Mayor, an at-large alderman or the alderman representing the district in which the property is located.
- ✓ A check for \$150 made to the City of Savannah
