What is CERN?

Chatham County-Savannah Metropolitan Planning Commission applied for a grant through the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Coastal Resources Division (GADNR CRD) in 2020.

Mission: CERN will engage regional community partners, municipal staff, and policymakers to coordinate equitable strategies to address the physical, economic, and social challenges Coastal Georgia communities face due to a changing climate.


Benefits to Local Jurisdictions:

- Collaboration through a coast-wide network to promote resiliency
- Creation of a forum for information, data, and experiences to promote community resilience, and develop a common framework for planning for resilience
- Strengthening the ability of the region to prepare, adapt, and respond to both short-term and long-term complex climate and weather-related challenges

Resilience:


the ability to prepare and plan for, absorb, recover from, and more successfully adapt to adverse events.

- Become a self-sustaining organization through modest membership dues, incorporation into city/county budgets, and grants






Resiliency 101 Course: Learning Objectives
