## Security Plan for Alcoholic Beverage License

---

### 1) Identification of days and hours of operation.

Wonderland Photography Studios will be open Monday through Sunday 8am until 6pm, by appointment only (no walk-ins). Photographers will book online at least 2 days ahead of time and will be permitted use of the space during their allotted booking.

---

### 2) Specific measures and procedures to address crowd management both inside and outside the premise.

When the studio spaces are booked, we require notice of how many people will be at the booking session. If someone wants to book the space for more than 8 people, we require approval ahead of time. This ensures that the space complies with the occupancy load and makes sure there is no large crowd inside the establishment.

There will be no crowds outside the establishment since bookings are by appointment only.

We do not have any no loitering signs.

We also have 6 security cameras throughout the studio that are monitored by the owners.

### 3) Identification of any parking areas owned or controlled by establishment.

Our customers will park on the street or in the West Broad parking lot. This parking lot is controlled by the landlord for the entire block, not the establishment.

### 4) Means of controlling access to the premises and parking area.

We control who comes in and out of our establishment by allowing customers to enter by appointment only. Outside of appointments, the doors will be locked. We also have security cameras.

We do not control the parking area, the landlord controls it. There is a sign that states it is for the West Broad block only and all others will be towed.

## 5) Security staffing.

We do not use, or plan to use, security guards.

## 6) Measures used to combat underage consumption of alcoholic beverages.

In order to ensure that individuals under the age of 21 are not allowed to buy/consume alcohol at our establishment, we (the owners and servers) will calculate the age by doing the math in our head. We will have a sign at our desk to remind us that "to consume alcohol, a person must be 21 years of age born on or before today's date in 20XX" (with an accurate year).

We will first ask the customer if they are interested in a complimentary beer or wine, if they say they are interested we will then ask them to show us their driver's license. We will then look at the birthdate on the driver's license and confirm they are over the age of 21. We will then tell them the options for beer and wine and serve them the drink of their choice (a maximum of 2 drinks per person).

## 7) Measure used to distinguish between patrons who are over and under the age of 21, where applicable.

We do allow individuals under 21 to enter. Therefore we will ask EVERYONE (who is interested in a complimentary alcoholic beverage) to show their driver's license, regardless of their physical appearance.

We will not have wrist bands/hand stamps, etc. However there will only be one person serving the alcohol on the premises during studio bookings, so it will not be necessary to have wrist bands or hand stamps. If the person serving is unsure if they previously confirmed someone's age, they will simply ask to see their driver's license again to confirm their age before offering them a second (and final) drink.

## 8) Measures and procedures to combat the risk of fire.

In order to prevent accidental fires, we do not allow smoking or for anyone to use candles. We also have security cameras, smoke detectors, fire extinguishers, and sprinklers throughout the studio.

- 9) Discuss matters related to managing emergencies, such as fires, evacuation tactics, assignment of employee duties during emergencies, and coordination with public safety.

In the event of an emergency, the staff member present will guide and evacuate all patrons out the front door (and only emergency exit). The staff member will already know how many people are present since photographers are required to indicate how many people will be present during studio sessions when booking. This way the staff member can do a head count once everyone is outside to make sure no one was left behind. Then the staff member will call the police.
