- Support the creation of the Savannah-Chatham County Interagency Council on Homelessness/Continuum of Care (ICH/CoC).
- Provide professional staff support to the ICH/CoC
- Address "Gaps" in the Local Service Delivery System

1. Creation of the Savannah-Chatham County ICH/CoC

Transition to the ICH Model

- Creation of new Governance Charter
- Built upon the original 13-15 Community Seats composed of local organizations, individual community members, representatives of projects serving the homeless
- Added 10 additional seats representing Executive level Managers/Directors of key Governmental Agencies with responsibility for managing critical public policies and services.

Ad Hoc Committees to Address Emerging Needs...

Extreme Weather Response Committee

- Plan for life threatening weather.
- Collaborate with member agencies to ensure the safety of unhoused community members.
- Educate the community on how to help during these situations.
- Coordinate the distribution of essential supplies.

Encampment Response Committee

- Create unified guidance on how to safely address encampments.
- Work with different government agencies to provide critical support.
- Coordinate with service providers to aid those living in encampments.
- Clean and secure areas to prevent encampments from reforming.

2. Provide professional support to the ICH/CoC

Executive Director role filled December 5, 2023

- Ensures homelessness coordination, convening and system partnerships receive the daily attention required to address needs and implement solutions to homelessness.
- Provides support to the ICH/CoC Board and its necessary daily operations.
- Assist City of Savannah and other ICH Members with priorities around homelessness, working with City Departments, County Departments, and other partners.

3. Addressing Gaps in Services

Street Outreach

- Expanded services to those currently staying on the streets by the Homeless Outreach Team from the Chatham Savannah Authority for the Homeless.
- Funding supported purchase of additional outreach van, increasing outreach and contacts with unsheltered individuals in more areas of the community.

Daytime Shelter & Support Services

- •Funded Union Mission's new Day Center, offering support services and providing an alternative to those without shelter during the day.
- •362 unduplicated individuals were served onsite since January 2023; an average of 59 people daily. A total of 65 individuals using the Day Center have successfully moved to some type of housing this year.

Happening Now!

- Two \$10,000 Day Center mini-grants were awarded to expand services to areas outside of the downtown area.
- Grants were awarded in Summer 2023 to Come As You Are Deliverance International Ministries and Park Place Outreach. Outcomes will be available in coming months.

What's ahead for the ICH/CoC:

A Community-Wide Plan for Addressing Homelessness & Creating More Housing Options



Develope a five-year plan to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-reoccurring.



Will serve as a vital roadmap for our community to utilize in setting direction, forging partnerships, and allocating resources.



Will build consensus and community buy-in among service providers, various government agencies, and other key stakeholders.

Begins Fall 2023, with a 6-month completion timeline
